

Curtis Pond Dam Is a Significant Hazard

- Rated "POOR" by State in 2019 inspection
- Climate change increases risk
- Additional flooding damage is possible
- State may not allow us to rebuild
- Loss of Town Beach, Island and State Access and potential closing of Maple Corner Community Store if dam fails



Fixing is Cheaper than Letting it Fail

Property Tax Increase Per Year Per \$100,000 Real Value

(If Town Bonds for \$500,000 at 3% annual payment = \$33,300)



If the dam fails, estimated loss of >\$3M from Grand List, \$86,000 per year in tax revenue, and \$2.3 million in tax revenue over the next 20 years

Now is the Time to Fix the Dam

- Funding is possible with the Federal infrastructure plan
- Interest rates are currently low
- The State is supportive, for now
- The dam could fail anytime in an overtopping weather event
- The State can decide to lower or remove the dam at anytime
- A "do nothing" strategy will cause cultural, economic and fiscal damage to the Town

We Can't Get it Done as a Private Organization

- We are asking the Select Board to set up a committee to study ownership and funding methods.
 - Affordable liability insurance is available to public entities through PACIF but not to private organizations.
 - The State is more apt to give permits to municipalities.
 - We have spoken to those who have any possible claim to the dam, and they are willing to sign a Quit Claim.
 - We have made contact with financial sources, and they require ownership to be a municipality.
- The Curtis Pond Dam Exploratory Group will help the Select Board wherever we can.
 - Willing to participate on the committee.
 - Willing to do the bulk of the committee work.
 - Willing to participate or lead informational forums in the community.
 - Willing to fundraise a minimum of \$100,000 towards the dam's repair.
